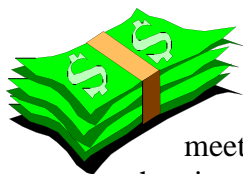

FBLA NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE IN DENVER

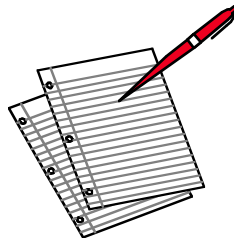
