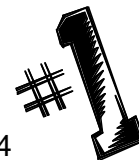

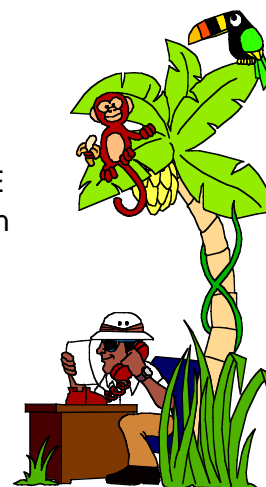
As part of your end of the year routine, please

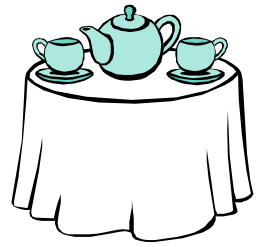
